***have no time to notice the things they could complain about!***

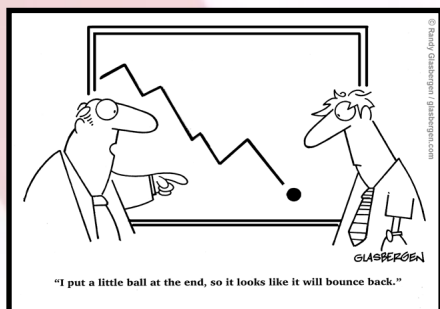

## **The Ocean at Home**

Didn't get a chance to make it to the beach this summer? Bring the ocean home with these fun activities.

### ***Ocean in a Bottle***

You will need: Plastic bottle, clear oil, blue or green food coloring, ocean charms &/or sequins, tiny seashells, glitter

Directions: Fill the bottle halfway with water and add charms, seashells, glitter, etc. then add the food coloring. Close the lid & shake. Unscrew lid and add the oil until the bottle is full.

Enjoy making waves, shaking, & letting it settle!

### ***Ocean Water***

Ingredients: 3 tbsp. water, 3 tbsp. sugar, 1 tsp. coconut extract, 3 drops blue food coloring, 2 cans lemon lime soda, 1 gummi fish

### ***Sand Dollar Cookies***

Ingredients: 1 roll Pillsbury sugar cookie dough & 1 bag of slivered almonds

Directions: slice dough, place almonds in a circle (to look like a sand dollar), bake as directed .
